NEWS FROM THE CLASS

Year P/1/2—Mrs Holloway

Overall students have been making steady progress with their reading fluency and remembering different spelling for the same sound. At the moment the students are keen to write and are exploring ways to describe a favourite pet using interesting words and similes.

In math the student have challenged themselves with skip counting and making groups of things. The progress has been pleasing to see. We will be moving on to division for the next few weeks of term.

In the science arena foundation to grade 2 have been learning the properties of solids, liquids and gases. They have done many experiments with trying to freeze different liquids – surprising fact- soya sauce doesn't freeze! They have also attempted to make a balloon pump to blow up a balloon and found a treasure in an ice block. This week was

making oobleck, they all thoroughly enjoyed the experience and deciding whether it was a solid or liquid.

Grade 4 to 6 have extended their knowledge into reversible and irreversible change and have used the scientific method to record their experiments. They have made a physical change in turning cream to butter and milk into ice-cream—"yum, ahh, brain freeze." The chemical change was turning milk into plastic. This was met with many comments of "this stinks."

The "Stop, Walk, Talk" strategy offers several benefits for primary-aged students by providing a simple yet effective approach to managing conflicts and emotions. This method empowers young learners to pause and assess a situation ("Stop"), choose to remove themselves from potential escalation ("Walk"), and then communicate their feelings or seek help from a trusted adult ("Talk"). By using this strategy, students develop crucial problem-solving skills, enhance their emotional regulation, and foster better interpersonal relationships. It also encourages a proactive approach to conflict resolution, helping them feel more confident and in control of their interactions with peers
